Goat Division

Rules and Regulations

Eligibility:

- A. Each junior member must be a bona fide member of a Woods County 4-H club or FFA chapter. Members must have neither graduated from high school nor reached their 19th birthday as of January 1, of the show. Youth can enroll in 4-H on their ninth birthday or at the beginning of the fall term of the 4th grade, whichever comes first. Youth who have reached their 9th birthday and have a current 4-H Enrollment Card on file in the Woods County Extension office prior to January 1 will be eligible to show at the Woods County Junior Livestock Show.
 - B. Exhibitors must have continuously owned and personally fed and cared for his exhibit for: Market Steers – 90 days; Prospect Steers – 45 days; Market Lambs and Barrows – 60 days; and Breeding Animals – 30 days prior to the opening date of the show.
 - C. Exhibitors may show 2 market steers, 2 prospect steers, and 2 heifers in the Beef Department; 3 gilts and 3 barrows in the Swine Department; 2 ewes and 3 market lambs in the Sheep Department; and 3 does and 3 wethers in the Goat Department.
1. Exhibitors must show their own animal unless the exhibitor has two animals in the same class or is excused by the Superintendent.
 2. Exhibitors must furnish their own woodchips and bedding.
 3. Any animal that has been sold at auction in any local, county, district, or state show is not eligible to be exhibited.
 4. No one other than the exhibitor, Ag-Ed Teacher, Extension Educator, another chapter or club member, 4-H Leader, or immediate family member may assist in the grooming of any exhibit during the show.
 5. The show management reserves the right to withhold any premium awards in the case of any violation of any rule governing the show.

Breeding Does show first then Market Wethers

Goats will be divided by weight as appropriate. (50 lb minimum, 160 lb maximum)

Goats will be weighed in at the time of the sheep weigh-in.

Animals must be owned by exhibitor.

Heifers will be divided by breed as necessary. Must be owned by the exhibitor. Classes will be divided by age.

Prospect Steers

Steers weighing between 890 and 910 pounds will be allowed to show either as a prospect or a market steer. The exhibitor must make the decision. Prospect steers will be weighed and put into classes as appropriate.

Lamb Lead Contest

The Woods County Lamb Lead Contest for all 4-H and FFA youth in the county will be held on **Saturday, February 21, preceding the Sheep Show**.

The Lamb Lead Contest has been designed to offer the 4-H and FFA youth of Woods County the opportunity to gain knowledge, experience and confidence through their work with the sheep and wool industry.

Contest Rules:

1. All contestants must submit a completed entry form to the Woods County OSU Extension Center by **5 p.m., February 18**.
2. Contestants must be a 4-H or FFA member.
3. There will be two age divisions: Junior (9 to 12) and Senior (13 and over).
4. Garments may be of any style, purchased or self-made, and at least 60% wool.
5. Any lamb can be led in the class and does not have to be owned by the contestant.
6. Contestants must make their own arrangements for the use of a lamb for the show.
7. Entry forms are available at the Woods County OSU Extension Center.
8. Participants cannot enter the same garments more than once in the county contest.
9. Lambs are not to be dressed in any fashion. They are to be led by a halter only.

Judging Standards:

The judging will consist of a personal interview (25%), presentation of lamb (25%), and presentation of the contestant (50%). The **interviews will be conducted at 1 p.m. in the Show Office on Saturday, February 21st**. Questions will be asked about the wool industry, sheep production, contestant's personal interests, and construction of the garment.

Prizes will be awarded as follows for the Junior and Senior divisions:

Reserve Champion - Plaque

First Place	\$8.00
Second Place	\$6.00
Third Place	\$5.00

6. If the amount of premiums exceeds the available funds, the show management will prorate the premiums on an equitable basis.
7. Market Steers – The two center incisors may be in but they must be below the cutting edge of the adjacent temporary incisors.
8. Ewe lambs must have temporary incisor teeth in place with no visible sign of permanent incisors. No teeth rule in 2006 for market lambs. No ewe lambs will be shown in the market lambs.
9. All exhibits will be released at the conclusion of the Goat Show.
10. Decisions of the show superintendents and the judges will be final.
11. The show management assumes no responsibility or liability for loss or damage that may occur at the show.
12. There will be only one weighing of any individual exhibit, and the decision of the weigh master is final.
13. All classes shall be placed according to their merit.
14. Water will be the only coat dressing allowed for swine. All other types of dressing are prohibited.
15. No Entry & Claim Forms for livestock.
16. **Lamb Lead entries are due by 5:00 p.m. on February 18 at the Woods County OSU Extension Center.**
17. No hair coloring is allowed in the grooming of any exhibit. Grooming rules will be the same as state shows.
18. Exhibitors will be expected to dress appropriately for their 4-H or FFA organization. 4-H members should wear a 4-H jacket or shirt; FFA members should wear an FFA jacket.
19. No glue allowed in the grooming of beef exhibits.
20. Oklahoma Youth Expo show rules and guidelines will be followed, unless stated otherwise in this program. The Oklahoma Youth Expo rulebook will act as a backup to the Woods County Spring Stock Show rules. Copies of the OYE rulebook are available upon request at the Woods County Extension Center.

Swine Division

Gilts – Berkshire, Chesterwhite, Duroc, Hampshire, Poland China, Spot, Yorkshire and Crossbred. Gilts must be owned by the exhibitor. Gilt classes will be divided by weight as appropriate.

Breeding Ewes

Ewe Lambs - Same for Southdown, Dorset, Natural Colored, Speckled Face, Shropshire, Hampshire, Suffolk, and Crossbred ewe lambs. Lambs must be the property of the junior exhibitor. Ewe lambs must have their lamb teeth.

Yearling Ewe - Same for Southdown, Dorset, Natural Colored, Speckled Face, Shropshire, Hampshire, Suffolk, and Crossbred ewe lambs. Lambs must be the property of the junior exhibitor.
